This document contains notes I'm providing for the Macintosh Special Interest Group of the Silicon Valley Computer Genealogy Group. I spoke to them on June 11, 2011, 9:30 a.m. <http://svcgg.org>, The notes are located at my **SVCGG Documentation Web Site** - <http://svcgg.bdgeorge.com>. There was so much interest in the World Wide Development Conference speech on June 6, 2011 by Steve Jobs, that we talked about that for an hour, and then spoke about the main topic, Reunion's Find command for a half hour. I listed the two topics here in reverse order.

Reunion Find Command - From the Reunion Menu, Click on "Find"

• Find "Anything"

- Easiest way to start Find Anything is to use CMD "F", but this list of Find options is obtained by clicking on "Find" in the top
- Fill out the conditions... Experiment with the condition, then the operator finding different things in your database. This will get you very familiar with your database. Click on the orange question mark and read up on FIND in the Manual. It's excellent.
- Click on "Find" to produce the "Found List".
- Up to three additional conditions may be added
- The findCan be used to find individuals or couples/LDS
- Very flexible, get to know all the variable types
- It is very useful to "find" people, and then mark some or all of the found people. Then most reports can be run only on marked people. After marking people, you can skip through them using CMD Right Arrow.

• Find "Relationship..." - Relationship of any two people in your database

- Find "Relatives" This is the same as "List I Relatives". A helpful thing to know is that this is where you set the "Source Person" in Reunion. To do that, go to the familycard of the desired Source Person, for example... yourself. Then click on "Find Relatives", then, where you have the choice of Identify or List at the top of the dialog box, click "Identify". Select your name, then click "Identify" at the bottom of the dialog box. Now, when you look at any related person on a family card, your relationship will be noted on the line above their name.

Relatives (Click

- Find "Treetops" - This finds the earliest known ancestor of a person on the currently selected family card. It's the same as the Icon Bar icon, called "Treetops".

• Find "Presets"

Learning Tool: Choose each preset and see how they work. Some of the presets just fill out the conditions for you. In database terminology, Reunion is helping you do a query. I'm commenting on a couple of presets that you need to know about.

- "Marked" and "Unmarked" lets you discover who's marked in your database. Example: Mark all relatives linked to you (CHANGE I MARKED GROUPS I PEOPLE LINKED TO YOU. Then find all unmarked people in your database. This will tell you who all the "orphans" in your database, are.

- “Changed Today”, “Changed this week” - Produce a list of people you’ve changed recently. Useful when you’ve made a mistake with Reunion, recently.
- “Unlinked People” - To create a list of people without parents, children, or spouses
- **Find “Overview”** - This is a five-generation pedigree chart you can use to help navigate through the database.
- **Find “Home”** - Goes to the home person. This does the same thing as clicking on the Home Icon on the Icon Bar. Hint: drag anyone’s name from their family card, to the Home Icon to set the home person.
- **Find “Back”** - Same as clicking on the Back Icon on the Icon Bar. It lets you see the family card that was showing before the current one. This is also called backtracking
- **Find “Forward”** - Same as clicking on the Forward Icon on the Icon Bar. If you use the Back button to backtrack, you can use the Forward button to retrace your steps
- **Find called from elsewhere**
 - List Statistics, Find Anything
 - **Relationship** - Relationship between two people (also List Relatives)
 - **Relatives** (same as List Relatives) - Set Source relative - see relationship
 - **Treetops** - Lists the furthest relative in the line that you have
 - **Overview** - 5 level pedigree chart with links to siblings. Single Click to reform chart, double click to go to family card - Very NICE!
 - **Navigation** - Backwards, Forward
 - **Find “ID#”** Look for people by their Reunion-assigned ID. Works with the person ID or a Family ID.
 - **Find “Replace”** - D A N G E R - Very flexible, but you should save copy of your FamilyFile first. It allows you to replace data in your database. Definitely look up the Manual information on this one, by clicking on the orange question Mark.

Apple WWDC 6/6/2011 Steve Jobs Video - Detailed Notes

These are notes I made while listening to Steve Jobs' two hour presentation to WWDC on 6/6/11. A video of the presentation is available on the <http://apple.com> web site. He presented three parts, (1) Lion; (2) IOS Improvements; (3) iCloud. I highly recommend watching the video.

Macintosh Lion Operating System - Will be available in July 2011, \$29

- 1 Better Touch Gestures - similar to IOS
- 2 Full Screen Apps like IOS
- 3 Mission Control - Control work spaces
- 4 Mac App Store built in
- 5 Launchpad - Similar to IOS
- 6 Resume - Saves your place
- 7 Auto Save & revert to last-opened
- 8 Versions - Like Time Machine
- 9 Air Drop - Personal Local Area Network
- 10 Mail - Full-Height with Summaries, E-Mail Conversation Special View will strip repeated forwarded text

Apple developed a migration assistant to help people migrating from Windows to a Macintosh.

IOS Improvements - Available later in Fall, 2011 - Developers can test it now - \$Free

1. Notifications - Notification Center - single place to make you aware - single swipe-Notifications auto remove - Lock Screen
2. Newsstand - Newsrack-type display, w/background downloads
3. Twitter - Single sign on, Twitter integrated into popular apps
tweet from Safari, Youtube, Use Twitter to update contact photos
4. Safari - Reader makes article front and center with single scrolling story. Email contents + link - Reading List added so you can read articles on other IOS devices - Tabbed Browsing lightening fast
5. Reminders App - Sync with iCal
6. Camera - Faster to "get in" and take photo, volume up button will take the button - pinch to zoom, AE/AF Lock, Edit photo - Redeye, crop, 1-tap enhance
7. Mail - Add RTF, indent, Drag addresses between To: CC BCC Search content of message - swipe for thumbnail emails - built in dictionary - split keyboard (works with all apps)
8. PC Free, Software updates over the air, delta updates,
9. Game center - Misc improvements
10. iMessage - New service between all IOS 5 customers. iPhone, iPad, Touch. Read Receipts, typing notification, send photos
11. Wifi sync to itunes

iCloud - Available Fall, 2011 - \$Free with 5gb of storage space. MobileMe will go away. *One point that wasn't specifically addressed was, what was going to happen to iDisk and all the web sites and download areas on MobileMe of people who paid \$99/yr. currently. In separate emails from Apple to myself, the current MobileMe accounts were extended for free to July 2012, so I suppose Apple may "take care of this issue".*

1. Automatically uploads
2. Integrates with your apps
3. Contacts, Calendar, Mail - need to keep up to date REWRITTEN to be cloud apps.
 - a. Contacts stored on the cloud & pushed to the other devices.
 - b. Calendar event stored in cloud pushed to other devices. Share calendars too
 - c. Mail - New Msgs pushed to all devices, no ads

THREE MORE APPS

 - d. App Store - Can see purchases on all devices
 - e. iBooks - Purchase History - New iBook downloaded to all devices, stores bookmarks on the cloud
 - f. Backup - Wireless backup to the cloud
 - Purchased music, apps & books
 - Camera Roll (photos and videos)
 - Device settings
 - App Data (90:17)
 - g. Documents/iWorks - Works over WiFi only. Pages document, stores to the cloud & pushes to other devices (Pages, Numbers & Keynote).
 - h. Photo Stream - Allows iPhoto to send Pictures to the cloud, Pictures Folder on PC, Apple TV will talk to the photo stream service. Cloud will store photos for 30 days. Photo stream is an additional menu item in iPhoto & Others
 - i. iTunes - Can download any purchased music at no additional charge, up to 10 computers.

Oh...and one other thing. Mac users can upload their ripped and non-purchased songs to the cloud for \$24.99/year. This lets you have ALL your music in one central place that can be downloaded to all your music devices. Although this is the only part of iCloud that costs anything, it might be worth it.

One item that should also be pointed out: iWorks was released for the iPhone, at no extra charge if you downloaded it for the iPad.
